


REDD+ Implementation

- ◆ Building on on-going short and long term policies
 - ◆ Maintain at least 50% of land mass as forest
 - ◆ Managing forest for its commodity to natural capital
 - ◆ Central Forest Spine and Heart of Borneo
- ◆ Building on existing systems
 - ◆ Sustainable forest management principles
 - ◆ Forest monitoring system
 - ◆ Land is under the jurisdiction of sub national government
- ◆ Cost effective measures
- ◆ REDD+ initiatives have only national funds



Transformational Changes in Forest Management



REDD+ Strategy

- Guidance on what will be achieved
 - 11 Targets
 - 25 Actions
 - 25 Key indicators
- Coordinated and accounted at national level
 - Reporting
 - Review
 - Reported at state level, then states will have to develop all requirements and responsible for the review process

Implementation of REDD+ Strategy

- ◆ Principles of benefits sharing
 - ◆ **Equity** – fairness in terms of the distribution of costs and benefits amongst stakeholders
 - ◆ **Transparency** - availability of relevant information and the capacity for all stakeholders to comprehend how and why benefits are transferred.
 - ◆ **Performance related** - action taken to reduce emissions actually occurs and results achieved
